PROGRAM OUTREACH ACHIEVEMENTS: JANUARY- APRIL 2015

Overview

The Navy's Community Involvement Plan (CIP) for Hunters Point Naval Shipyard (HPNS) lists several ways for the HPNS cleanup team to reach out to the HPNS community, including quarterly summaries of community involvement achievements and goals for the coming months. This update summarizes the HPNS public involvement activities held between January and April 2015, as well as upcoming activities and documents scheduled for May and June 2015.*

Community Meetings

The HPNS cleanup team continued to hold regularly scheduled meetings on:

Topics: *Informational Poster Session, Radiological Program Update*

At the April Community Meeting, informational posters about the Radiological Program at HPNS were displayed around the meeting room. Navy subject matter experts and regulatory officials were available to answer questions and discuss the Radiological Cleanup Program at HPNS with community members.

Poster topics included:

1. **Introduction and Welcome**, which outlined the poster board topics
2. **What is Radiation**, which described radiation and common sources of radiation in the environment
3. **Radiation Sources and Locations**, which identified the historical sources and locations of radiation at HPNS
4. **Radiological Cleanup Process**, which outlined the three cleanup steps for radiological contamination: Investigate, Remediate, and Confirm

5. **Extent of Radiological Cleanup**, which gave a summary of the Radiological Program cleanup achievements to date
6. **Radiation Management and Disposal**, which described the standard protocol for managing and disposing of radiological waste
7. **Protecting the Public**, which summarized the on-site controls and procedures in place at HPNS to ensure public safety

In addition to the posters, the Navy distributed an **informational fact sheet** which summarized each poster, the **2015 HPNS Calendar of Community Events**, and the **Quarterly Progress Update** for cleanup activities between October and December 2015. *If you would like a copy of any of these handouts, please email info@sfhpn.com.*

NAVY BASE REALIGNMENT AND CLOSURE (BRAC)



In 1988, the Department of Defense created the Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) Program to oversee the cleanup and transfer of military bases to public or private groups for redevelopment.

HPNS was added to the BRAC Program in 1988, and the Navy has been working since that time to clean up hazardous waste created by former shipyard use.
