Overview

The Navy's Community Involvement Plan (CIP) for Hunters Point Naval Shipyard (HPNS) lists several ways for the HPNS cleanup team to reach out to the HPNS community, including quarterly summaries of community involvement achievements and goals for the coming months. This update summarizes the HPNS public involvement activities held between April and June 2016, as well as upcoming activities and documents scheduled for July through September 2016.

Community Meeting

Topic: *Dust Control During Cleanup at HPNS*

At the April Community Meeting, the Navy gave a presentation to local community members and focused on answering the following questions:

- ◆ What is dust and why is it created during cleanup activities on HPNS?
- ◆ How does dust affect me as a community member?
- ◆ How is the Navy controlling dust?
- ◆ Where can I find more information on dust?

Following the presentation, several meeting participants asked questions about the information presented and how dust created during cleanup activities at HPNS may affect them.

In addition to the presentation and the question/answer period, poster boards on soil management and truck management (as they both specifically relate to dust control during cleanup at HPNS) were available for additional discussions. Navy team members were available to answer any questions.

Bus Tour

On Saturday, May 14, 2016, the Navy hosted two tours of the cleanup activities at HPNS. A total of 63 community members attended the combined tours, which included the following tour stops:

- ◆ Stop #1: Parcel E-2 Landfill
- ◆ Stop #2: Radiological Portal Monitor
- ◆ Stop #3: Truck Tire Wash
- ◆ Stop #4: Parcel E Radiological Screening Yards
- ◆ Stop #5: Parcel G Durable Covers and Drainage Swales
- ◆ Stop #6: Parcel D-1 Gun Mole Pier and Crane
- ◆ Stop #7: Parcel C Durable Cover Installation
- ◆ Stop #8: Parcel B Revetment Wall
- ◆ Stop #9: Parcel B Sites 7 and 18

In addition to technical cleanup information at each tour stop, historical information was provided by the Navy, and supplemented by members of the community during the tours! *Join the next tour in August to see the Navy's progress at HPNS. See page 2 for more details on the upcoming tour.*

**NAVY BASE REALIGNMENT
AND CLOSURE (BRAC)**



In 1988, the Department of Defense created the Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) Program to oversee the cleanup and transfer of military bases to public or private groups for redevelopment.

HPNS was added to the BRAC Program in 1988, and the Navy has been working since that time to clean up hazardous wastes created by former shipyard use.

The HPNS cleanup team includes the United States Navy, the United States Environmental Protection Agency, the California Department of Toxic Substances Control, and the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board.
