



**PUBLIC NOTICE
FIVE-YEAR REVIEW
NAVAL RADIO TRANSMITTING FACILITY DRIVER
SITES 1, 7, AND 10
SUFFOLK, VIRGINIA**

The Department of the Navy completed a Five-Year Review of the Long-Term Monitoring (LTM) Program at Naval Radio Transmitting Facility (NRTF) Driver, located in Suffolk, Virginia. This is the third Five-Year Review for NRTF Driver. NRTF Driver is located 13 miles west of Portsmouth, Virginia near the Nansemond River. The purpose of the Five-Year Review is to ensure that the remedial actions chosen for Site 1, Oyster Creek Landfill; Site 7, West Disposal Area, and Site 10, West Disposal Hillside are providing adequate protection of human health and the environment. A summary of the Five-Year Review is provided below. The full, final Five-Year Review report can be viewed at the public information repository listed below. The next Five-Year Review for NRTF Driver will occur in 2019.

FIVE-YEAR REVIEW SUMMARY:

Site 1, Oyster Creek Landfill: This site was reportedly used as a landfill for wastes generated from housing and military activities conducted during the 1950s until 1972. The selected remedy for this site is comprised of LTM and land use controls (LUCs). No issues or deficiencies were identified during the Five-Year Review. The remedy is protective of human health and the environment.

Site 7 West Disposal Area: This site consists of a waste area used for disposing materials such as telephone poles, concrete and brick foundations, and other large items used in antenna construction between 1964 and 1973. The selected remedy for this site is comprised of surface debris removal, installation of a twelve-inch deep soil cover, LTM and LUCs. No issues or deficiencies were identified during the Five-Year Review. The remedy is protective of human health and the environment.

Site 10 West Disposal Hillside: This site reportedly included a deteriorated 55-gallon drum, an intact 55-gallon drum, paint containers, and construction debris. The selected remedy for this site is comprised of the removal of surface debris and LUCs. No issues or deficiencies were identified during the Five-Year Review. The remedy is protective of human health and the environment.
