



## FIVE-YEAR REVIEW

Former Naval Air Warfare Center Warminster, PA



The Department of the Navy, in cooperation with Region III of the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP), has begun the fourth five-year review of the remedies implemented at the Former Naval Air Warfare Center (NAWC) Warminster, Pennsylvania.

The purpose of a five-year review is to ensure that the selected remedies are effectively protecting human health and the environment. The five-year review process is mandated under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA) (also known as Superfund) for sites where the selected remedial action results in contaminants remaining above levels that allow for unlimited use and unrestricted exposure. This fourth five-year review will be completed by November 21, 2016.

The Navy will conduct interviews, review reports, and assess site conditions to evaluate if the remedies remain protective of human health and the environment. Public participation is encouraged and welcomed.
