



FIVE-YEAR REVIEW

The Department of the Navy, in cooperation with the Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE), has begun the third five-year review of the remedies implemented at the Former Naval Surface Warfare Center - Carderock Division - Annapolis Detachment Former David Taylor Research Center and Bay Head Road Annex Sites.

The purpose of a five-year review is to ensure that the selected remedies are effectively protecting human health and the environment. The five-year review process is mandated under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA) (also known as Superfund) for sites where the selected remedial action results in contaminants remaining above levels that allow for unlimited use and unrestricted exposure. This third five-year review will be completed by February 18, 2015.

The Navy will conduct interviews, review reports, and assess site conditions to evaluate if the remedies remain protective of human health and the environment. Public participation is encouraged and welcomed.
