



**NOTICE OF INTENT TO SIGN  
FINDING OF SUITABILITY TO TRANSFER  
(FOST) PHASE 3C  
FOR FORMER NAVAL AIR STATION  
ALAMEDA  
ALAMEDA POINT, CALIFORNIA**



The Department of the Navy (DON) announces its intention to sign the Finding of Suitability to Transfer (FOST) Phase 3C for portions of Alameda Point (formerly Naval Air Station Alameda) in Alameda, California. Alameda Point is located on the northwestern tip of Alameda Island, which is on the eastern side of San Francisco Bay. In 1936, the U.S. Navy acquired the land from the U.S. Army and built the Naval Air Station. The base was operated as an active naval facility from 1940 to 1997. The FOST for approximately 15 upland acres of Alameda Point concludes that property specifically identified in that document is environmentally suitable for transfer in accordance with Section 120(h) of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act. Maps and descriptions of the property proposed for transfer are included in the FOST.
