## PROGRAM OUTREACH ACHIEVEMENTS: APRIL—SEPTEMBER 2013

### Overview

The 2011 Community Involvement Plan (CIP) listed several ways for the Hunters Point Naval Shipyard (HPNS) cleanup team to reach out to the HPNS community. The Navy agreed to prepare a quarterly summary of community involvement achievements and goals for the coming months. This Quarterly Update summarizes the activities held between April and September, 2013.

### Community Meetings

The HPNS cleanup team continued to hold bi-monthly community meetings at various locations in the HPNS community. During the second quarter, the Navy held two community meetings:

- ◆ **April 24, 2013**  
*HPNS Building 101 Auditorium*  
*Topic: Cleanup Progress at Parcel B and Parcel G*
- ◆ **June 26, 2013**  
*Bayview Opera House*  
*Topic: Navy's Five-Year Review of Progress at Hunters Point Naval Shipyard*

At the April meeting, the Navy presented an update on the cleanup achievements at Parcels B and G on the former Shipyard. At the June meeting, a comprehensive overview of progress at all active cleanup sites at HPNS was provided. The June meeting also included a presentation by the Navy to explain changes to the Parcel C Record of Decision (ROD). The revisions to the Parcel C ROD will be documented in an Explanation of Significant Differences, which will become a formal part of the cleanup documentation in the Navy's Administrative Record.

### 2013 Community Events

The Navy had the opportunity to participate in three Bayview community events between April and September: Earth Day on April 20, 2013; Sunday Streets on June 9, 2013; and California Coastal Cleanup Day on September 21, 2013. The Navy booths provided an opportunity for Navy team members to provide informational materials and answer community members' questions about cleanup activities at the former Shipyard. In addition, sign-up sheets for the HPNS mailing list and HPNS Bus Tours were available.

### Shipyard Bus Tours

The Navy held two bus tours of the cleanup sites at HPNS on Saturday, August 24, 2013.

The popular one-hour guided tours allowed members of the community to visit the sites and ask questions of the Navy and regulatory agency representatives. Community members have reported that this is one of the best ways to learn about the cleanup activities at HPNS.

In 1988, the Department of Defense created the Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) Program to oversee the cleanup and transfer of military bases to public or private groups for redevelopment.

HPNS was added to the BRAC Program in 1988, and the Navy has been working since that time to clean up hazardous waste created by former shipyard use.
