Recent Community Meetings

Radiological Data Evaluation Update Community Meeting Open House

On Wednesday, January 31, 2018, approximately 150 community members attended a community meeting open house hosted by the Navy. This meeting provided an opportunity for the public to receive an update on the Navy's ongoing radiological data evaluation at HPNS.

In addition to Navy representatives, a poster station was staffed by independent third-party radiological experts who offered information and answered questions about radiological health and safety. These experts were also able to discuss the independent analysis and oversight that they have provided, and continue to provide, during the HPNS radiological data evaluation.
