

Current Situation



- Health and safety remains the highest priority for the Navy.
 - No public health hazards have been found to date.
- The Navy will conduct radiological surveys of all housing units.
 - All work will be conducted with State oversight.
- Surveys result from an unexpected finding under an unoccupied housing unit.
 - The radiological anomaly was detected beneath the foundation of non-leased building 1101.
 - The Navy surveys will be performed to confirm that no radiological materials are present beneath other housing foundations.
- Feb 2014 RAB Meeting: some residents requested radiological surveys of their homes.
- The Navy is committed to keeping TIDA and the public informed.

What Does the Navy Plan to Do?



- Conduct radiological surveys in all leased housing units within Site 12 by using equipment to scan the ground floor of each housing unit.
 - Will require the movement of furniture and miscellaneous goods.
 - Navy coordinating access with TIDA and Housing Service Providers.
- Provide the survey results as soon as possible.
- Coordinate all aspects of the survey with Regulatory Agencies.
 - US Environmental Protection Agency Region IX (USEPA)
 - California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC)
 - California Department of Public Health (CDPH)
 - Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB)
 - City of San Francisco Department of Public Health
