

**MEETING MINUTES
RESTORATION ADVISORY BOARD
NAVAL WEAPONS STATION SEAL BEACH DETACHMENT CONCORD
CONCORD, CALIFORNIA
SEPTEMBER 7, 2005**

These minutes reflect general issues raised, agreements reached, and action items identified at the Restoration Advisory Board (RAB) meeting for Naval Weapons Station Seal Beach Detachment Concord (Detachment Concord), California. The meeting was held from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. on September 7, 2005, at the Concord Police Department Community Room in Concord, California. Agreements and action items are described by topic under Sections I through V and are summarized in Section VI. A list of participants and their affiliations is included as Attachment A, and the meeting agenda is included as Attachment B.

I. WELCOME, INTRODUCTIONS, PUBLIC COMMENT, AND AGENDA APPROVAL

Welcome and Introductions

The RAB Community Co-Chair, Mary Lou Williams (Concord resident), called the RAB meeting to order and initiated a round of introductions for attendees.

Public Comments

Ms. Williams opened the floor to public comments. No public comments were offered.

October 2005 RAB Agenda Approval

Margaret Wallerstein, PhD (Navy co-chair) reviewed the proposed agenda for the RAB meeting on October 5, 2005, which will take place at the Concord Police Department Community Meeting Room in Concord, California. The Navy plans to provide a presentation on the Site 27 Proposed Plan (PP). Ms. Wallerstein asked the RAB to approve the October 2005 agenda. The RAB approved the agenda.

II. AUGUST RAB MEETING MINUTES APPROVAL

Ms. Wallerstein asked the RAB for comments on the minutes from the meeting on August 3, 2005. No comments were offered.

Action Item

1. The Navy will complete and distribute the final RAB meeting minutes for August 3, 2005.

III. COMMITTEE REPORTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Ms. Williams opened the floor to committee reports and announcements.

Grass Fire

Ms. Wallerstein announced that there was a small grass fire that burned all of Remedial Action Subsite (RASS) 4 and a small corner of Site 31. The Contra Costa County Fire Department responded to the grass fire and extinguished it.

RAB Site Tour

Ms. Wallerstein reminded the RAB that the site tour will take place on Sunday, September 18, 2005. All of the RAB members attending the site tour will need to provide Ms. Wallerstein with their driver's license number for base access. Ms. Wallerstein will send the RAB an e-mail to remind them to provide their drivers license number prior to the site tour on September 18, 2005.

Action Item

2. Ms. Wallerstein will send the RAB an e-mail to remind them to provide their drivers license number prior to the site tour on Sunday, September 18, 2005.

IV. REMEDIAL PROJECT MANAGERS (RPM) UPDATE

Navy Update

Steve Tyahla (Navy RPM) reviewed the Navy RPM update (Attachment C). Mr. Tyahla stated that the Annual Amendment to the Site Management Plan (SMP) was completed as a "revised draft final" on August 25th and distributed. The Navy had a discussion with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) on August 19, 2005 to resolve some EPA concerns on the August 10th draft final Annual Amendment which led to the distribution of the revised amendment on August 25th. On September 6th, the EPA approved the August 25th revised Annual Amendment to the SMP, so it now serves as the current cleanup schedule.

Mr. Tyahla provided preliminary results from the Site 29 groundwater sampling that occurred on August 2, 2005. Elevated concentrations of trichloroethane (TCE) were present in groundwater. Currently the Navy is preparing a strategy for further groundwater characterization for discussion with the Agencies.

Mr. Tyahla provided the RAB the preliminary results from sampling performed at Tidal Area Site 11 (the Wood Hogger Site) where the Navy recently collected samples to determine the extent of mercury in site soils and sediment. Based on the results, which showed mercury in a wider area than anticipated, the Navy will need to do additional characterization for mercury at Site 11.

The Navy is currently contracting the work at the Site 1 Tidal Area Landfill. The company TN & Associates is the awardee of the contract for the Site 1 Landfill cover work.

Gregory Glaser (Danville resident) stated that he reviewed the Draft Final Annual Amendment of the SMP and the Site 29 PP schedule has been delayed. Mr. Glaser wanted to know if the Site 29 schedule delay was due to the high hits of TCE found. Mr. Tyahla confirmed that the high detections of TCE and determining the next steps has delayed the Site 29 schedule, which is currently "on hold" as described in the revised draft final Annual Amendment to the SMP. The Navy will ask the EPA for a schedule extension on the work needed at Site 29 once the approach has been discussed with the Agencies.

EPA Update

Phillip Ramsey (EPA) summarized the activities and correspondence EPA provided during August 2005.

Mr. Ramsey stated that EPA is pleased in general with all of the site work that the Navy has accomplished.

Mr. Ramsey stated that EPA does not agree with the Navy's conclusion on Site 11 mercury sampling results, which show that there is no significant mercury contamination in the sediment within the slough at Site 11. The RPMs have tentatively planned a meeting on September 20, 2005 to discuss the next steps for investigating Site 11. Mr. Ramsey stated that mercury contamination is a risk to human health and ecological receptors. Mr. Ramsey is working with their consultants to determine EPA's recommendations on the mercury contamination.

Mr. Ramsey said that EPA submitted comments on the Draft Site 27 PP to the Navy on August 11, 2005. EPA is recommending that the Navy provide additional institutional controls (IC) for Site 27 since the Inland Area of the Detachment Concord will most likely be part of the 2005 Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) list. Mr. Ramsey stated that the Navy is planning to have the Site 27 PP public meeting in October 2005.

Mr. Ramsey said that EPA submitted comments on the Taylor Boulevard Bridge Disposal Site Action Memorandum to the Navy on September 2, 2005. EPA is recommending that the Navy dig up the contaminated soil and haul it off site. EPA does not completely agree with the Navy's proposed removal area footprint or number of samples they have proposed. The RPMs are discussing the next steps for the Taylor Boulevard Bridge Disposal Site.

Mr. Ramsey said that EPA submitted a final approval letter on the revised draft final Annual Amendment of the SMP to the Navy on September 6, 2005. Now that the Navy received EPA's approval on the SMP, the team has to wait for Congress to approve the funding for fiscal year 2006 for the SMP to be final. In the meantime, the revised draft final Annual Amendment is to serve as the schedule.

Mr. Ramsey stated that EPA attended a site visit to the sampling effort the Navy was conducting in the Litigation Area marsh on August 9, 2005.

Mr. Ramsey stated that EPA attended the monthly RPM meeting on August 31, 2005.

Mr. Ramsey stated that EPA met with the City of Concord on the base transfer process on August 31, 2005. The meeting opened the lines of communication between EPA and the City of Concord to discuss the reuse of the Inland Area of Detachment Concord.

Mr. Ramsey was conducting a routine drive by site check at Detachment Concord when he spotted the grass fire at RASS 4 and reported it to the Navy on September 2, 2005.

Mr. Ramsey stated that EPA is in the process of reviewing the Draft Final Site 22 Sampling and Analysis Plan (SAP) as well as the Tidal Area mercury investigation results. Once EPA comments are complete, the RPMs will schedule meetings to discuss them.

EPA is almost finished with their final review of the Site 17 Record of Decision. Once EPA Management has signed and approved the document, it will be sent back to the Navy to be distributed for signature to the other RPMs.

Mr. Ramsey reminded the RAB that EPA is a resource to them. Mr. Ramsey is open to individual discussions as well as group meetings if the RAB is interested in asking EPA for assistance with technical issues.

Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) Update

Michelle Trotter (DTSC) announced that she has been assigned to three new sites, which include General Chemical, Chemical and Pigment, and Honeywell. General Chemical is in the process of renewing their permit and will have a future public comment period. Once General Chemical has scheduled their public comment period, Ms. Trotter will notify the RAB.

San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board (Water Board) Update

Laurent Meillier (Water Board) distributed the Water Board RPM update (Attachment C).

Mr. Meillier said that he attended all of the monthly RPM meetings in August 2005. On August 31, 2005, the Water Board had internal discussions about the Navy's applicable or relevant and appropriate requirements (ARAR) list that was distributed to the RPMs for review. The Water Board has provided comments on the Navy's ARAR list. Water Board staff and its associated legal counsel will review ARARs as applicable to documents submitted within their scheduling constraints. Water Board staff will then forward these comments to DTSC for compilation and forwarding to DTSC.

Mr. Meillier stated that the Water Board is concerned with the high (4.3 ppm) hits of TCE the Navy found at Site 29. The Water Board wants to make sure that the areas further downstream from Site 29 are protected. Water Board staff is concerned as well with the high detections (88.5 ppm max) of Total Mercury in soils and Sediments west of Site 11 (Tidal Area, former Wood Hogger Site).

Mr. Meillier attended the Underground Storage Tank (UST) RPM meeting on August 31, 2005. The UST RPMs discussed the TT-10 through TT18 tanks that the Navy has requested for closure.

V. RAB ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES PRESENTATION

Gregg Smith (Navy) and David Cooper (EPA) provided an overview of the RAB Roles and Responsibilities. The presentation is included as Attachment D.

Mr. Cooper announced that starting in October 2005 he will be working on a 6 month assignment in Washington D.C. at EPA Headquarters. Mr. Cooper stated that while he is in Washington D.C. there will be another EPA community involvement coordinator assigned to attend the RAB meetings. Mr. Cooper will still be involved in reviewing some of the Detachment Concord documents that will be coming out while he is in Washington D.C.

Bill Shinn (City of Concord Council member) asked how the Navy determines the cleanup level for each site. Mr. Tyahla stated that the Navy does not have a legal obligation to clean up the base to residential standards, or "unrestricted use." The Navy determines the cleanup level based on the type of contamination present at the site and the anticipated reuse of the site is considered. The Navy also, per CERCLA, considers the cost of cleanups. Where feasible, cleanup to unrestricted use criteria is the goal since no further action, including 5-year reviews and monitoring, are necessary.

Mr. Glaser asked how the Navy is planning on dealing with the cleanup of the Tidal Area after the BRAC of Detachment Concord takes place. Mr. Smith stated that the Navy is looking at various ways to cleanup the Tidal Area. It is possible that the Army will assume cleanup responsibility of the Tidal Area.

Jessica Hamburger (Contra Costa Resource District) asked if there is liability assumed for someone who is interested in purchasing land in the Inland Area after the cleanup is complete. Mr. Smith stated that future liability is still under discussion. Ms. Trotter stated that Mare Island is currently going through the

early transfer process and the Navy, the City of Vallejo, and the City's developers are negotiating the liability as well as the land reuse.

Mr. Meillier asked about the relationship between RABs and Community Advisory Committees (CAC) during the cleanup process at other installations. Mr. Smith stated that RABs and CACs should intermingle as long as they make sure to keep in mind that their goals and issues are different and need to be kept separate. Ernie Galang (Navy) stated that at Treasure Island, the RAB co-chair also sat on the CAC.

Ms. Hamburger asked if the Navy still has to clean up sites that are going to be used for wildlife habitat. Mr. Tyahla stated that no matter what the future use of the site is, the Navy still has to comply with the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act requirements.

VI. NEXT MEETING AND ACTION ITEMS

The next RAB meeting is scheduled for 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. on Wednesday, October 5, 2005, at the Concord Police Department Community Meeting Room in Concord, California.

RAB Meeting Update December 2005

Laurent Muller RWQCB

Meeting Attendees

- ✚ **August 19 2005: CNWS SMP meeting**
 - ➔ The Team discussed the need to include pre-final and final designs phases into the SMP.
- ✚ **August 31 2005: CNWS Plenary RPM meeting**
 - ➔ Water Board staff stated that they will commit to their own internal process for ARARs review based on the legal counsel schedule which could overflow beyond the 30 days Navy deadline. Once this ARARs review is completed their legal analysis will be forwarded to DTSC for compilation.
 - ➔ Water Board staff is very concerned by the groundwater detection of 4.3 ppm in TCE at Site 29. Water Board staff has recommended prompt action from the Navy to confirm these results and delineate the extent of the contamination impact. It is essential to determine if Seal Creek found downgradient has not been deleteriously impacted by the release of chlorinated hydrocarbons.
 - ➔ Water Board staff is also concerned by the recent detections in soils and sediments in Total Hg within Otter Slough. A maximum detection of 83 ppm was recorded for this contaminant at the site.
- ✚ **August 31 2005: CNWS UST Sites RPM meeting**
 - ➔ Water Board staff is amenable to consider closure of the TT10-TT18 UST sites cluster. However, the Navy needs to submit a closure report as well as a database record demonstrating that there is hydrologic separation with the site found upgradient. Of course, this site will need to meet Water Board ESLs for TPH impacts to soils and groundwater. Water Board staff urged the Navy to excavate and dispose of the highly probable UST recently detected during a geophysical survey.
 - ➔ The Navy agreed to write a request for closure for Site IA-19.
 - ➔ The Navy submitted this week the electronic records for UST sites E85, IA-6, IA-19, IA-19A, IA36, IA55, IA58, 7SH5, 87, and 96.


- Summary of Navy Remedial Project Manager (RPM) Activities since the last RAB Meeting held on Wednesday, August 3, 2005.
 - **August 10-** The Navy issued a letter to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) submitting its “Draft Final Annual Amendment to the Site Management Plan (SMP)”. [The SMP is the cleanup schedule under the Federal Facility Agreement (FFA) between the EPA and Navy. Annually, an amendment is to be issued by the Navy to update the schedule. The draft of this year’s amendment was submitted by the Navy on June 10th. EPA provided comments on July 13th and this draft final version responds to EPA’s comments.]
 - **August 19-** The Navy, EPA, and San Francisco Bay Region Water Quality Control Board (SFBRWQCB) had a telephone conference call to discuss the above Draft Final Annual Amendment to the SMP.
 - **August 25-** The Navy issued a letter to the EPA submitting a “Revised Draft Final Annual Amendment to the Site Management Plan (SMP)”. [After submitting the above draft final SMP amendment on August 10th, the EPA had further comments on the SMP which were discussed during a phone call on August 19th. Based on that discussion, the Navy submitted this “revised draft final” SMP amendment. In its transmittal letter, the Navy requested the EPA’s concurrence on the acceptability of this revised SMP amendment.]
 - **August 31-** The Navy met with the project managers from the EPA, CA Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC), and SFBRWQCB. [This was our regular monthly meeting.]
 - **September 1-** The Navy issued a letter to EPA providing the “*Draft Final Sampling and Analysis Plan (Field Sampling Plan/Quality Assurance Project Plan), Additional Investigation at Site 22- Southwest Fence Line and Seal Creek, Naval Weapons Station Seal Beach, Detachment Concord.*” [This draft final sampling plan responds to comments received on the May 12, 2005 draft version of the plan. Per the FFA, since this is a draft final Primary document, the EPA has 30 days from receipt to dispute the document or it serves as the final.]

- Base re-use likely to be controversial
 - Remain focused on the RAB mission
