



FIVE-YEAR REVIEW
GIRARD POINT MANAGEMENT AREA
NAVAL STATION
PHILADELPHIA, PA



The Department of the Navy, in cooperation with the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP), has begun a third five-year review of the remedy implemented at the Girard Point Management Area Landfill at the former Naval Station Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The purpose of the five-year review is to ensure that the selected remedy for this Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA) site is effectively protecting public health and the environment. The five-year review process is mandated under CERCLA (also known as Superfund) for sites where the selected remedial action results in contaminants remaining above levels that do not allow for unlimited use and unrestricted exposure. The information gathered will be evaluated to determine whether the remedy remains protective of human health and the environment. It is anticipated that the five-year review process will be completed in June 2014, and a final report will be available at that time.

The Navy will conduct interviews, review reports, and assess site conditions to evaluate if the remedies remain protective of human health and the environment. Public participation is encouraged and welcomed. If you are interested in participating in the interview process, please contact the BRAC Environmental Coordinator.
